

## **Communication and Language**

Take your child out for an Autumn walk. Ask your child to talk about what they can see.

Listen to different sounds the leaves make and encourage your child to talk about them.

## **Mathematics**

Collect some autumn treasures, such as leaves, sticks, conkers, acorns and pine cones. Can your child count how many of each they have found?.

## **Expressive Arts and Design**

Collect leaves of different shapes and sizes and do some leaf printing using different colours.

## **Personal, Social and Emotional**

Help your child develop their turn taking skills by taking turns in blowing leaves. See who can blow their leaf the furthest.

## **Physical**

Support your child fine motor development with some leaves cutting.

## **Literacy**

Share a selection of Autumn themed story books with your child. Draw your child's attention to the language of front cover, words and pages.

## **Understanding the World**

Take your child out for an Autumn walk. Ask them to look around at all the different things they can see. Encourage them to talk about what they notice and how their surroundings have changed from the summer.
